1. SYME new director Charity is still adjusting at her new role. May God help us to be her good helpers with understanding and humility. We hired two new young Taiwanese girls Vivian and Stephanie (former SYME students) to take care of Enrollment and Advancement along with the present accountant Jean. My wife Wen will be the supervisor of the team of three girls. Please pray that Wen can become their spiritual leader who will guide them with grace and truth.

2. Other than the SYME regular summer term, our camp team has completed 6 camps in 4 cities reaching out to about 300 kids and youth. Many received Jesus as their savior innocently during the one-week camp. May the grace of Jesus Christ can provide environment and follow-up opportunities so none of them would be lost. 3. There were some special-need student enrollment into our summer term at SYME. Two with Asperger syndrome, one with Facial Paralysis (even a simple smile would trigger hard endured pain for her), some with learning disability and being bullied in school. I thank God for their willingness to share their testimonies at chapel time without fear. More than half of the students this term were non-Christians. They all shed tears after hearing those testimonies. A student from Vietnam received Christ at the end of the term. Two students finished 4 terms at SYME and will continue their faith journey by entering WOL Bible Institute in Jeju Island. 4 students will continue to be our fall term students. PTL!

4. Simon's dad has recovered from Acute Kidney Failure nicely since March. After passing the physical exam, he was admitted into a well-equipped senior day-care center started the last week in late August. It's close to home and has regular daily activities organized by well-trained social workers. It runs from 8am to 4pm Monday to Friday which provides a more meaningful life for dad and as the same time provides relief for mom and my siblings. (below right)
